Hello,

We are writing to encourage you to apply for funds that will improve your farm's soil health. We hope this letter will answer the first questions you have, and encourage you to follow up with any other questions.

Why are you sending this to me?

We think you own or rent ag land in the Dry Run watershed (see map). As such, you are eligible to receive funds and make decisions on how our funds are spent.

What is the Dry Run Farmer-Led Watershed Council?

A group of farmers working together to improve on-farm profitability and stewardship of nutrients on our fields in our neighborhood.

Who's on the council and where do you get your money?

Any farmer who operates or rents farmland within the watershed can be part of the council. We don't keep an official list of members right now, farmers are invited to attend meetings and provide input. Current active members include (but aren't limited to) Kevin Conard, Jake Erickson, Kyle Mitchell, and John Van Dyk.

Our funds come from a grant our group received from the McKnight Foundation (about \$10,000 a year) as well as a grant from DATCP which is focused on Farmer-Led groups like ours providing benefits to our region. This year, we received \$10,000 from DATCP to provide incentive funds and host field events.

How do I get some money?

Fill out the enclosed application. If something doesn't make sense, call one of the numbers on it and we or our partners will walk you through it. Better yet, come to a council meeting. Our next meeting is on March 8th at the Rooster Roadhouse at 11:30.

I think the council should pay for something else that's not listed on the application sheet.

Well that's not really a question. But it's a fair point. The best next step is to show up at a council meeting and provide your perspective or call one of us. The council is truly farmer-led, and as a farmer, that means you can be a leader. As long as your project will somehow improve soil health on your farm or reduce potential pollution to surface or groundwater, we are open to hearing it.

Is this a government program?

No. But we partner with a couple of organizations to do the administrative stuff for our group. St. Croix county holds some DATCP funds for us so we don't have to manage the financial paperwork.


