

**HORSE CREEK AREA WATERSHED COUNCIL
CONSERVATION INCENTIVES 2024**



Please check the incentive(s) you are interested in. Incentives only apply to land within the watershed. You may sign up for more than one. Funding is limited and will be first-come, first-served. We reserve the right to pro-rate payment amounts if sign-up exceeds funding availability. **Deadline for sign-up is June 1st.** For soil sample incentives, a record of sampling and analysis must be submitted by December 1. Payments will be made by December 31. Payments for incentives will be administered by the Polk County Land and Water Resources Department staff.

____ **\$80 stipend to cover costs of well water testing.** This one-time stipend is made available to applicants looking to learn more about their well water quality by taking a recent well water test. Applicants will receive a well water test kit and following lab results will have access to information to help interpret their results. The test result data will NOT be made public. Applicants will be contacted by the Polk County Land and Water Resources Department staff for sample instructions and kits. Lab analysis must be presented as proof of payment to be eligible for the stipend listed. *See insert for more information.*

____ **\$4/acre for new soil samples,** taken in 5-acre increments or less, and review. *You may take the samples yourself or use a consultant.* You must provide proof of sampling and analysis to receive the incentive and must be willing to share your sample results with the council. *Note - The data will not be made public, but you may be asked to complete a short survey quantifying any fertilizer reductions or nutrient management plan efforts implemented as a result of this incentive.*

____ **\$1/acre payment for phosphorus indexing.** The phosphorus index is a number that indicates the potential for phosphorus loss from a field. It is calculated using soil sample results and other factors including distance to a water body, slope, soil type, tillage practices, etc. If you already have a nutrient management plan for your operation and you are actively updating this plan you would be eligible for this incentive.

____ **\$20/acre for planting a fall seeded cover crop** in a growing crop or following the crop harvest (**Maximum 150 ac**). Cover crops may include any species of small grain (winter rye is recommended). Multi-species mixes are eligible. Cover crop must be planted in a growing crop or after the harvest of the crop but no later than October 15th. Cover crop must be fall or spring terminated. Priority will be given to first-time participants. Non-highly erodible acres will only be available to new participants to the program. Incentives for cover crop planting may be pro-rated according to available funding. Watershed council members can provide guidance in cover crop establishment. Council contact information can be found on the reverse side.

____ **\$250 stipend for consultation on streambank stabilization and improvement.** This incentive is intended to provide options for streambank erosion repair or streambank stabilization practice options and applies to riparian landowners adjacent to Horse Creek or its tributaries. Landowners that have identified streambank erosion or stabilization concerns will receive a \$250 stipend for scheduling and completing an on-site consultation with conservation practice professionals within the Polk County Land and Water Resources Department. Upon request, Land and Water staff will perform a site visit to evaluate the area of concern, provide options for repair, and discuss potential cost share funding sources. *Note - Participants will be encouraged but not required to complete repairs of streambank areas to receive the stipend.*
